Christmas time is here. You're busy. I'm busy. The world is busy. Every single place you go the next few weeks is just going to be and feel BUSY! We are so anxious to get to Christmas that we race through the waiting; we race through the anticipation – in short, we race through Advent. Advent is one of the holiest seasons for Christians, yet unlike Lent, it tends to get short shrift, because we're all so distracted. We don't have time to think about Advent because we're too busy thinking about Christmas. Advent, like Lent, is meant to be a time of contemplation, of quiet and peaceful anticipation of Christ. It is a time to take a moment and prepare, prepare for our Lord who will come so quietly into this world, in such an unassuming, so UN-BUSY way. Yet, we don't contemplate, we don't anticipate, we don't take time to quietly prepare; we race around, we're frantic, we just want to get through it. In the midst of the chaos, we miss the holiness, we miss the chance to deepen our faith this holiday season. We miss the chance to connect with Christ during this season that we all demand should be all about him in the first place! So, this Advent season I am extending a challenge to all of us. It is a challenge that I took up last year, and had a blast doing, while also finding space and time to reflect in the process. a picture of what you did. Alternatively, you can e-mail them to me, or you can put them all together in a collage that you can share with your church family when Advent is over. Perhaps you can choose to do it for yourself and enjoy the journey. Whatever you decide to do, just enjoy it! Maybe each member of your family has a smart phone – encourage everyone to take their own pictures for the day and the word, and then share them around the dinner table, talk about what they mean for you and what they make you think about faith and Christ. Use it as an opportunity to talk authentically about faith. Use it as an opportunity to grow. Use it as an opportunity to learn more about your own faith and the faith of your loved ones. I know it's a little out there, but this year, let's decide to rethink Advent together, because we might just be surprised at the outcome.

HOW CAN YOU HELP OTHERS THIS CHRISTMAS?

Everyone has traditions that they keep each Christmas season. Some congregants have changed their family traditions to help others around the holidays. If you're searching for a way to give back to others this year, read through the following ideas from Grace members.

#1: Sponsor a family in need at the Ronald McDonald House by providing gifts for them so that they can celebrate the holidays, even in the midst of a difficult situation. Time and funds are usually in short supply for these families. To know you are providing them with the means to have a little light of joy in the midst of the darkness is a powerful thing to experience.

#2: A group of families decided that instead of doing Pollyanna gifts for each other, they would take all of their monies and put it together to help another family. They helped a family that comes to the food pantry by providing clothing and toys for the children, clothing for the adults, and by purchasing a Dutch oven cooker (since the family had no stove - only a two-plate burner to make all of their food). In addition, they cooked Thanksgiving dinner and delivered it to the family on Thanksgiving Day.

#3: A group of children agreed to give up \$20 of their Christmas money from their grandmother to purchase a lamb for a village in Africa. Their willingness was such a blessing to the entire family and they knew the lamb was certainly a blessing to the villagers.

#4: One family provides each of their children with a set amount of money each Christmas to donate to the charity of their choice. The children got so excited from choosing a charity that in following years, they have added some of their allowance money on their own.

The Thanksgiving Food Distribution is now only a memory, but what a memory! We had 52 volunteers help to set up the sanctuary on Sunday afternoon and 49 help with the distribution on Monday. The workers outside loading boxes in client cars faced adverse weather conditions including rain and wind, but they persevered and managed to give food to 251 families. Each family received four cartons of food and a bag of health care products, which means that over 1200 packages were handled in one day! The work didn't stop then, however. Jack, Jay, and Tom delivered food to 21 shut-ins on Tuesday, gave food to six more on Thursday, and 16 clients came for food on Friday – and there were more families served Thanksgiving week. Which brought our total to 314 families. "This is a mixed blessing," said Jack Warntz. It is a record for the food pantry and we are so blessed that we can serve so many people, however, it is such a sad fact that there are so many in need right in our community. Thanks to all who helped complete this overwhelming outreach mission here at Grace Lutheran.

Our next packing dates are December 6 and 13, beginning at 8:30 a.m. If you have not helped with the packing, it is a very satisfying activity for adults and children as well. Think about making this a Christmas activity for your family.

We are in need of children's clothes (especially girls'), children's toys, stuffed animals, and knick-knacks for our Christmas distribution on December 15. If you have any of these items, please consider bringing them to church before December 14 so they can be included in our set-up. If you need assistance in bringing donations, please contact Jack or Ellen and we will pick up your things.

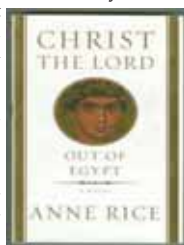


BOOK CLUB

HAPPENINGS IN OUR CHURCH FAMILY

A Letter from Kendra Shaffer

To my family at Grace, Katie Koepf is a graduate of Red Lion 2001 and is a

teacher at North Hopewell Winterstown Elementary School. Her family has been hit with a devastating diagnosis about her 4-year-old son, Landon. He has stage 4 Neuroblastoma.

Neuroblastoma is a cancer of the network of nerves that carry messages from the brain throughout the body. It is a cancer that often forms in childhood, though it is usually diagnosed after it has spread.

Neuroblastoma may be caused by genetics. Symptoms include bone pain, lumps in the abdomen, neck or chest, weakness, bulging eyes, and more. Treatments include radiation, chemotherapy, surgery, and more.

She has now had to take a leave from the school to be with Landon, and I would really like to help them out in this most difficult time of their lives. So I'm asking anyone who would like to donate any amount of money to help them out; it would be greatly appreciated.

A Letter from Dr. Asuquo Inyang

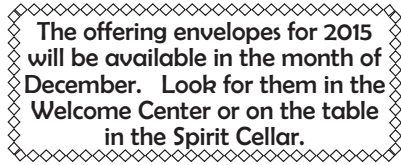


The Dr. Inyang took a recent mission trip to Calabar, Nigeria. He passed along the following letter of thanks to Grace:

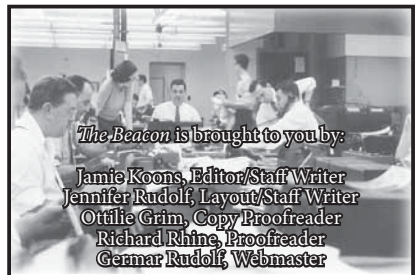
