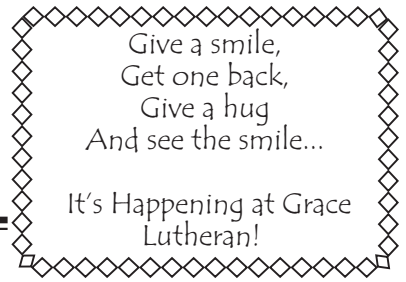

## From the Pastor's Desk: Name that Verse!

"Do not fear for I am with you, do not be afraid for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my victorious right hand" (Isaiah 41.10 NRSV).

When I was entering into my final year of Confirmation, our pastors put a challenge to us. We were to find a verse in the Bible that we felt spoke to our faith at its deepest and helped us describe our journey with God in its truest form. It was a bit daunting at first. How do you find ONE verse in a book chock full of verses, to describe a journey that was intricate, complicated, intimate, and deep? Yet, as each of us dove deeper into the project, we started to enjoy it. It encouraged us to not only explore the Bible more, but to reflect in new ways on the faith that we all shared, but which was also unique to each of us.



I'll admit, it was tough going though, trying to sift through and figure it all out, and as I told this year's group of confirmands, I ended up finding mine in a rather unorthodox way. One night, I was taking a break and doing a couple of word searches, and sometimes in the book I was in, there would be small puzzles, where the words to find, were the words of a Bible verse, so you sometimes had to find "the" or "and" that way you completed the whole verse. Well, right there in front of me were the words of Isaiah 41.10. I did my puzzle, but then I couldn't get the words out of my mind. My sisters gave me a little grief for potentially finding my Confirmation verse in a word search book, but once I examined the rest of Isaiah 41, and read words of extreme comfort and protection from God, to the people of Israel, I knew I had found my verse. I was a young kid, going through the typical slings and arrows of transitions, middle school to high school, kid to teenager, really figuring out who I was, and these words of protection, of not living in fear, of God's presence, they brought comfort and hope, and to this day, they still do. Words chosen in such a strange way, at such a young age, and yet they continue to echo through my faith journey, meaning different things at different points, but always returning me to the promise of God's love and strength.

This year, I have extended the same challenge to our confirmands—to find a verse to share with the congregation that speaks the deepest to their faith journey. It can be kind of scary, getting up in front of a group of people and sharing something about your faith, and so to give our confirmands a little bit of encouragement, I want to expand the challenge to all of us. Take some

time, and find a verse that fits you and your faith. Let your mind wander into unknown points of scripture, explore the Word of God we have been blessed with, and find where it speaks the most to you. When you have found it, find one of our confirmands and share it with them, take up the same challenge that they have, and speak your faith verse out loud. Take this journey with them, and revel in where it takes you. On Confirmation Sunday, we also celebrate Pentecost, the birth the church, and so on that

Sunday, there will be a large poster board where folks will be invited to write their "Confirmation verses," so that we can celebrate together who we are as the church, who we are as a community. We can learn more about each other, and what makes Grace Lutheran Church a unique place in God's creation. So give it some thought, explore the Word, and on Confirmation Sunday, come ready to celebrate our young folks as they take the next step in their journey, and remember your own journey as well. Affirm your faith with them, affirm your baptism with them, and affirm you identity as a beloved child of God.

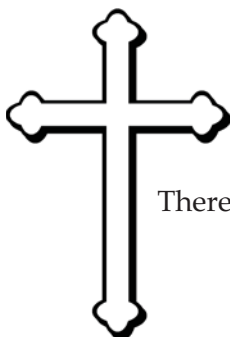
VBS IS COMING IN AUGUST

WOUNDED WARRIOR PROJECT

Thank you to all who gave an offering on May 25, Memorial Day Sunday. The offering on that date was donated to the Wounded Warriors Project.

Wounded Warrior Project® (WWP) serves veterans and service members who incurred a physical or mental injury, illness, or wound, coincident to their military service on or after September 11, 2001 and their families. On that date, America watched in horror as approximately 3,000 people died including hundreds of firefighters and rescue workers. Many warriors note a sense of duty to volunteer for the military following these tragic events. For WWP, there is a distinct difference between members and alumni; the term alumni indicates a mutual shared experience in an organization well earned. There are no dues here - those were paid by wearing the uniform and on the battlefield.

With the mission to honor and empower Wounded Warriors, WWP is the hand extended to encourage warriors as they adjust to their new normal and achieve new triumphs. Offering a variety of programs and services, WWP is equipped to serve warriors with every type of injury – from the physical to the emotional, and often invisible wounds of war.

## SOME THINGS JUST DON'T ADD UP!

As you are all aware, Grace Lutheran Food Pantry was awarded ten thousand dollars by Thrivent. This was in response to our congregation raising an additional twenty thousand dollars to match their challenge. On paper this looks fantastic...and it is, but dollars don't pack boxes or set up the sanctuary or help to distribute food boxes to our clients. Just because we have additional funds to purchase food doesn't mean that our job is finished.

Without your help, the money is only half of the equation. On May 17, our first packing date, the number of volunteers was small. Packing requires only the ability to push a shopping cart around in a big circle while someone loads boxes with food. Parents with small children tell us that this is a wonderful opportunity to show their children the fulfilling feeling that comes from helping others. Helping to set up the sanctuary requires the ability to fold and stack clothing, something that most of us do every day or at least on wash day! You even get a great lunch when you volunteer for this event. Assisting on distribution day might require you to work in the alley during all kinds of weather, but there are places inside the sanctuary that truly need your kindness and compassion as we assist our clients to "shop" for things displayed there. If you remember Jesus' words from the Bible, he never said to his followers, "Don't forget to put your money in the plate." He constantly demanded that they feed his people, clothe his people, and love his people. If you want to feel excited about your faith, consider helping the Food Pantry not just with your generous donations, but with a generous donation of your time.

# APPLES

A few years ago a group of salesmen went to a regional sales convention in Chicago. They had assured their wives that they would be home in plenty of time for Friday night's dinner. In their rush, with tickets and briefcases, one of these salesmen inadvertently kicked over a table which held a display of apples. Apples flew everywhere. Without stopping or looking back, they all managed to reach the plane in time for their nearly-missed boarding...ALL BUT ONE! He paused, took a deep breath, got in touch with his feelings and experienced a twinge of compassion for the girl whose apple stand had been overturned.

He told his buddies to go on without him, waved goodbye, told one of them to call his wife when they arrived at their home destination and explain his taking a later flight. Then he returned to the terminal where apples were all over the terminal floor.

He was glad he did. The 16 year-old girl was totally blind. She was softly crying, tears running down her cheeks in frustration, and at the same time helplessly groping for her spilled produce as the crowd swirled about her; no one stopping and no one to care for her plight. The salesman knelt on the floor with her, gathered up the apples, put them back on the table and helped organize her display. As he did this, he noticed that many of them had become battered and bruised; these he set aside in another basket. When he had finished, he pulled out his wallet and said to the girl, "Here, please take this \$40 for the damage we did. Are you okay? She nodded through her tears. He continued on with, "I hope we didn't spoil your day too badly."

As the salesman started to walk away, the bewildered blind girl called out to him, "Mister..." He paused and turned to look back into those blind eyes. She continued, "Are you Jesus?" He stopped in mid-stride...and he wondered. He gently went back and said, "No, I am nothing like Jesus. He is good, kind, caring, loving, and would never have bumped into your display in the first place." The girl gently nodded: "I only asked because I prayed for Jesus to help me gather the apples. He sent you to help me, so you are like Him - only He knows who will do His will. Thank you for hearing His call, Mister."

Then he slowly he made his way to catch the later flight with that question burning and bounding about in his soul: Are you Jesus? Do people mistake you for Jesus? That's our destiny, is it not? To be so much like Jesus that people cannot tell the difference as we live and interact with a world that is blind to His love, life and grace.

If we claim to know Him, we should live, walk and act as He would. Knowing Him is more than simply quoting scripture and going to church. It is actually living the Word as life unfolds day by day.

You are the apple of His eye even though you, too, have been bruised by a fall. He stopped what He was doing and picked up you and me on a hill called Calvary and paid in full for our damaged fruit.

Besides her Good Shepherd ministry, Corinne is a Staff Accompanist at Duquesne University, maintains a private piano studio and holds the Keyboardist position with the Westmoreland Symphony. Corinne is an active member in the Pittsburgh Chapter of The American Guild of Organists and has earned the Colleague Certificate from the national organization.

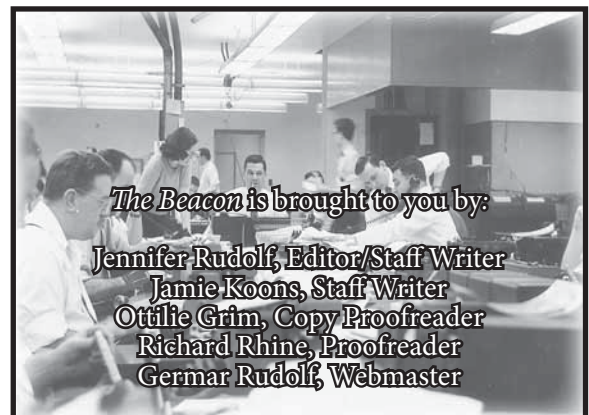

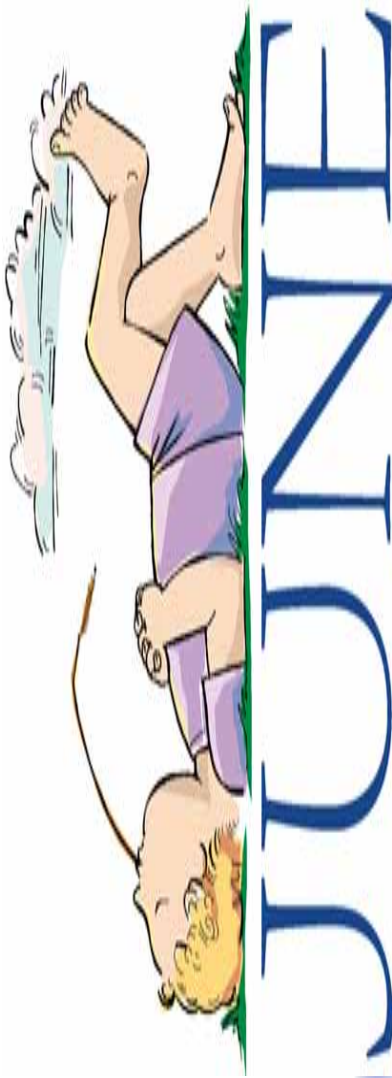
